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BRIDGING ACADEMIA AND PRACTICE: PPAG OPENS ITS DOORS TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GHANA MEDICAL SCHOOL STUDENTS

The Planned Parenthood Association of Ghana (PPAG) has opened its doors to some students of the University of Ghana Medical School (UGMS) to benefit from practical, Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) instructions at PPAG's facilities. This is part of the Association's mandate as a Center of Excellence to be a learning hub.

The over 30 medical students interacted with medical staff of the Association on service delivery areas such as Male health, Digital Health Interventions, Comprehensive Abortion Care (CAC) and other maternal health issues. In their interaction with service providers at the PPAG Family Health Clinic, the soon-to-be doctors received answers to some critical questions regarding the practice of medicine with SRHR specialty.

At the Association's Youth Center, youth officers encouraged the students to exhibit adolescent friendliness in their line of duty in order to encourage uptake of service by adolescents.

The visibly impressed students testified to having learnt a lot of best practices on confidentiality and child policies during the tour at PPAG that will guide and improve their profession in the field.

PPAG AND EYEH SOUP KITCHEN IN PARTNERSHIP TO PROVIDE FREE REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH SERVICES FOR STREET CHILDREN IN ACCRA

The Planned Parenthood Association of Ghana (PPAG), in partnership with the EYEH Soup Kitchen, served over a hundred young people living on the streets of Accra with Reproductive Health and Rights Information and Services, soft skills training in hairdressing for females, karate learning and sporting activities for the males. PPAG provided services like screening for malaria and treatment of minor ailments. The EYEH Soup Kitchen provided these young people with hot meals, water, drinks, snacks and clothing. PPAG and EYEH having observed the many issues of rape, teen pregnancies and other reproductive health vices on the streets of Ghana's capital organizes these outreaches regularly to provide Sexual and Reproductive Health essentials to young people. Mrs. Antoinette Da-Rocha, a project coordinator at PPAG encouraged pregnant teens on healthy ways to navigate the pregnancy phase as well as advising them on the importance of antenatal and post-natal services. There was education on family planning especially for teenage girls to help them to delay pregnancy after delivery, while service providers offered other reproductive health services per the needs of each young person.

This forms part of efforts to give young people hope and opportunities to better their lives while on the streets as well as working at getting as many of them off the streets into a meaningful and sustainable livelihood. The young people appreciated the generosity and support extended to them by PPAG and EYEH Soup Kitchen.





INNOVATION: EMPLOYING **SPORTS FOR REPRODUCTIVE** HEALTH EDUATION

The Youth Action Movement and the Young and Wise Center (Tamale) have stormed second cycle schools in Ghana's Northern region as part of their in-school sports for reproductive health education initiative. According the National President of the Youth Action Movement-Ghana (YAM-Ghana), Mr Aliu Iddrisu, this event was arrived at when the Movement brainstormed innovative ways to reach out to young people with Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights Information and Services (SRHR).

"I am happy to see such huge numbers of young people receive education and information on reproductive health while exercising and keeping fit. SRHR information empowers young people to live responsible lives and make the best decisions in life". Mr Iddrisu revealed that the event will spread its catchment to all other second cycle and tertiary schools within the Tamale Metropolis. He was impressed that, the very first session has received great attendance by young people.




